I hope all is well with you and your family during the pandemic. We are experiencing something that we have never experienced in our lifetime.

For the last few months we haven't put out a newsletter due to the fact that we weren't able to have Executive Board meetings. The Ironworkers Hall and Banquet Facility has strict rules that they must follow allowing them to keep their license and could not deviate from the Governor's orders. During the shutdown, all grievances went through first and second steps. When the Board convenes again and we are able to have membership meetings, the grievances will be voted on whether to go to arbitration or miniarbitration.

When COVID-19

first started, as President of the union, I worked day and night trying to make sure our members had everything they needed. Just to give you history of emails with the company...

March 16, 2020 – I sent a letter to Karen Novo requesting to develop safety procedures.

March 17, 2020 – email to Lou Giardina requesting hazard pay.

March 18, 2020 — had a notice posted to block off seats directly behind operators. Chris Antholzner requested the notice be removed because the company doesn't agree.

March 20, 2020 – I had a conference call with Tom George, Lou Giardina, Amy Hughes, Steve Scime and Wayne Gradl to discuss blocking off the front seats, maximum capacity, extra

cleaners.

March 20, 2020 – email to the company regarding paid sick leave.

March 27, 2020 – another email to the company blocking off front seats, maximum capacity and extra cleaners.

March 31, 2020 – email to the company about an emergency sign up.

April 8, 2020 – agreement to use Metrolink operators as cleaners.

April 8, 2020 – recovery day given to Metro active employees.

April 9, 2020 – request information on standard operating procedures, positive test results, potential exposure, health and safety reports.

April 13, 2020 – email reminder about moving

chains and bus capacity.

April 14, 2020- email requesting a new Metrolink sign up due to confusion with the sign up.

April 15, 2020 – request for additional gloves.

April 16, 2020 – email to company to move the chains to create more separation from the driver.

April 16, 2020 – posting "passengers must wear face coverings"

April 17, 2020 – posting "employees required to wear face masks:

April 17, 2020 – discussion with the company that operators should only be picking up essential passengers.

April 17, 2020 – employees are now considered essential workers and can get the COVID-19 test.

April 20, 2020 – email about the 220-day workday requirement, FMLA.

April 21, 2020 – April Baskin sent the letter with concerns about passenger safety.

April 22, 2020 – sent over a MOU for the company to sign regarding hazard pay for membership. The company refused.

April 22, 2020 – email the company again about essential ridership. Only a 15-person capacity on buses and 2-person maximum capacity on Paratransit.

April 22, 2020 – Metro decided to stop providing

gloves as it gives a false sense of security, so the union purchased 12,000 pairs of gloves from New York plus another 8,000 here in Buffalo.

April 28, 2020 – NFT Metro agrees to the 15 passengers on the bus and 2 passengers on Paratransit.

The emails continue, too many to list as well as phone calls continuing on a daily basis. We will continue to make sure that all our members have their personal protection equipment. I submitted a Freedom of Information request detailing how much money came into the NFTA Metro and how much have they spent. I have the breakdown at the office.

Brothers and Sisters, I am on a conference call every week with our International President and over 500 ATU Presidents across the US and Canada. We give updates on what's going on within our Locals. Many of our ATU Brothers and Sisters have lost their lives due to COVID-19 including union Presidents and Board Members that were personal friends. Thousands of ATU members across the country currently have or have had COVID-19. One of the hardest things that President's have to do is to speak to the family members of a deceased member. I am extremely happy that we were

proactive instead of reactive which I believe saved lives at Local. Over 30,000 our Amalgamated Transit Union workers are laid off across the US and Canada with more following this week. Many of you may not know that the Paratransit Division. Coin Room and Fare Collection at the Rail would have been laid off, but the union and company worked together and were able to keep everyone working by moving them in other departments. Everyone kept a paycheck.

In case you missed it, I've included a Buffalo News Article about the company looking for \$50 Million from Washington for COVID-19 relief.

We know that our contract expired July 31, 2020. We've met with the company on four occasions so far trying to negotiate a contract that is fair for the hardworking men and women of this union. As soon as we get a proposal that is fair, we will bring it back to the membership for a vote.

I want to thank the Executive Board and Stewards for all the hard work you're doing. Keep up the great work. The most important people in the Union are the workers, so thank you for being faithful to your job as an essential frontline worker and first responder.

NFTA seeks \$50 million in Covid-19 relief to avoid 'devastating position'



The NFTA says it needs \$50 million from Washington to keep its buses and trains running and its airports functioning amid a pandemic that has drastically reduced its revenues.

The Niagara Frontier Transportation Authority is crafting a proposed \$216.7 million budget to keep its buses, trains and two airports running – just like it does every year.

But with steep reductions in revenues stemming from Covid-19, the agency administering public transit in Erie and Niagara counties now looks to Washington for \$50 million in help. Like organizations in so many other aspects of life in a pandemic age, the NFTA says Washington must come up with some form of assistance, or the ensuing reductions in service and personnel will be drastic.

"Like all transit systems and airports across the nation, without additional federal Covid relief funds, we will find ourselves in a devastating position," NFTA Executive Director Kimberley A. Minkel said Thursday following a budget presentation to the board of commissioners.

Budget officials noted about \$17.5 million will be needed to maintain current service levels at just the airports and the downtown bus terminal.

Airport parking operator lays off 90 due to Covid-19 dropoff

In a filing today with the state Department of Labor, SP+ said the furloughs instituted at the beginning of the pandemic in March have now become permanent.

"Additional funding is desperately needed to help see us through this pandemic. To balance this budget, we need \$50 million in federal assistance," Minkel added. "Without this assistance, it will have a significant impact on our airports, Metro operations and the many people who desperately rely on the services we provide. Additionally, it would have an enormous economic impact on our region."

Indeed, commissioners heard another recitation of grim statistics at its annual budget review session. Revenues are down 57% at Buffalo Niagara International Airport (where passengers have declined to 87% of normal); 71% at Niagara Falls International. And fares paid to ride Metro Bus and Rail are totaling only about 12% of total revenue, less than half their usual level.

Minkel also told her board members that that the American Public Transit Association – the agency trade group – says Congress will need to provide \$32 billion to the nation's systems in the next few months. (APTA also announced Thursday that a survey it sponsored found 77% of Americans favor emergency transit funding.)

Minkel also noted the downstate Metropolitan Transportation Authority announced thousands of layoffs this week, though she has not specified the extent of layoffs or service reductions that loom locally for the NFTA should the emergency funds not materialize.

Mandating mask use on Metro Bus and Rail: 'It's a challenge'

Since the pandemic's onset in March, the NFTA has not only encouraged mask use, but initiated a vigorous sanitizing program.

The executive director said the authority has initiated a number of steps to control costs, including a hiring freeze, and will not rely on airport revenues to balance the books of Metro Bus and Rail. She envisions an annual savings of \$16 million by next year.

The final budget, with amendments, will be voted on in March, in conjunction with adoption of a state budget expected to feature a multibillion-dollar deficit.

"This budget has been put together with a lot of variables and uncertainties," Minkel said, adding that even more questions loom over revenues from the county sales tax, county mortgage taxes and state transit assistance.

It is expected that the authority will now work with the local congressional delegation to relay its needs to Washington.


